DO YOU HAVE A COMMUNITY, UNIVERSITY OR PRACTICE-BASED RESEARCH PROJECT REQUIRING FUNDING?

Applications are invited for grants to support oral health research, specifically targeting children and adolescents; people of all ages with physical, intellectual, behavioural, or cognitive disabilities, or who are medically compromised; people experiencing inequalities of outcome (e.g. Maori, Pacific Island, and low-income populations); and older adults. Research could also focus on promoting oral health, building links with primary care and building the oral health workforce. Research may also focus on Maternal Oral Health as identified in the Ministry of Health's report *Maternal and Child Oral Health - Systemic Review and Analysis*.

The Ministry of Health dental research funding source is managed by the NZDA and its Research Foundation, and offered in addition to the Foundation's annual mid-year funding round.

Closing date for applications in 2012 – 30 April

The Foundation offers assistance to dental practitioners with the preparation of their research protocols and in developing their research applications to ensure compliance with current grant application techniques. Enquiries should be made to NZDA Associate Director of Research and Policy, who will forward the names of experienced researchers willing to provide such guidance. For university researchers unfamiliar with current grant application techniques, the Foundation strongly recommends they consult with their research supervisor(s) and/or senior research colleagues.
